2020 has been a challenging year for all, with covid-19 permeating all aspects of our Trade Union. For Young workers, this has been no exception and presented a unique challenge to ourselves looking to organise as Regional Leads. On the other hand, I feel the challenges we have faced this year have shone a light on the contribution young workers make to industries which have been conceded only recently to be essential.
